General Orders No. 4

2019-2020 Series

1. Pursuant to Department of Oklahoma By-Laws, the Department Commander is hereby calling a Council of Administration meeting to be held on Saturday, 2nd of November at 1000hrs at the Department Headquarters located at 1103 N. Blackwelder Ave. OKC OK.

2. Pursuant to Internal Revenue Services Non-Profit Organization laws, all VFW entities with a non-profit status are to have their tax returns (Form 990) filed no later than 15 November in order to maintain their Non-Profit Status. Failure to file form 990, 990 N etc. for a period of 3 years will have their non-profit status automatically revoked by the IRS. If needed, an extension can be requested by the Non-Profit Organization by filing an IRS Form 8868 and returning to the IRS.

OUR MISSION: The Oklahoma VFW Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, assists Oklahoma veterans and their families, promotes patriotic programs, provides relief for veterans and veterans support organizations, and provides educational scholarships.

After a very productive, full-day strategic planning session with the leadership of the Texas VFW Foundation, the Oklahoma VFW Foundation established its mission statement (above). Some of the guidance they provided was there is value in the philosophy of learning to walk before you run. Based on that, our Foundation plans to set up two to four programs that fit within that mission statement to focus on. With specific, defined programs with clear goals; fundraising for those programs will be much easier because we can clearly answer the question "what will you do with the money we donate or grant you for this program?" We can then use the record and success of those programs as a building block for future larger programs and grants.

Currently, the Foundation Board is brainstorming program ideas with each Board Member being asked to provide basic program ideas they think the Foundation should use as a starting point. The hope is to have a list of 20-25 various programs that the Board can then discuss in detail and narrow down into two to four that we think that we can do and do well based on our staffing and resources. If you have a possible program you would like to see the Foundation consider, please feel free to email me at okvfwfoundation@outlook.com and I will add it to the list of programs that the Board will discuss.

As always, if your Post or District (or Auxiliary) is working on a grant and the donor will only work with a 501(c)(3), contact us as we can help by being the conduit for that grant. Also, if you are aware of a grant but are not sure how to apply, contact us as we can help with the application process as many of our Board members have experience in grant applications. Finally, have you (and your auxiliary) applied for the \$1,000 community service grant that is available from the National VFW Foundation? If not, why not? The application is by far one of the easiest that there are.
