Program-wise we are pressing along. As of this writing, I have received five district entries. The turnout is looking great and I cannot wait to see the final results. Judging for VOD/PP/TOY will be accomplished January 11th, 2020 at 1pm at the OSU Student Union in Stillwater. "Doc" Schmitz will be our guest of honor and I ask that everyone come out to the conference and give the CIC a true "Oklahoma Welcome!" I know we ran into some headaches with the hotel at Fall Fest. FROM THE OKLAHOMA VFW FOUNDATION

OUR MISSION: The Oklahoma VFW Foundation, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, assists Oklahoma veterans and their families, promotes patriotic programs, provides relief for veterans and veteran support organizations, and provides educational scholarships.

Comrades,

As 2019 is coming to an end, 2020 looks like it will be an amazing year for the Oklahoma VFW Foundation. Here are some items that we are working on...

- **Founding Donor Program:** Are you interested in being recognized as someone who helped get the Foundation going? We are going to recognize the first 200 people/entities that donated at least \$100 to the Foundation with a commemorative pin, a certificate, and recognition on the Foundation's website. We are also creating a Founding Sponsor program for donors that contributed at least \$1,000 to help get us started



- The Board looked at 10 different possible programs to focus on and have prioritized all ten. The top three priority programs that we decided on are: first, we want to create programs to help fund the Veteran Service Officer program, second, create a program to help fund the Patriots Pen and Voice of Democracy scholarship programs at the Department level, and third to help fund Honor Guards for veterans' funerals. The Board will now start working on the details of each of these programs and will let VFW membership know of the details once they are ready for official roll out.

However, these last few months of 2019 have been exciting, recent events have included...

- We have received donations of cemetery burial plots and cremation plots in two different cemeteries in the Oklahoma City metro area, the value of these combined donations is nearly \$20,000. Our board will be discussing how to make sure the donors' requests are met, but we are thankful that we were able to help these families make this type of non-traditional donation and are equally thankful that they considered us.
- As part of being a conduit for Post donations from organizations that will only donate to 501(c)(3) organizations, we are currently working with Post 1317 in Shawnee and with Post 577 in Tulsa on obtaining donations.

- We recently awarded a \$1,300 donation to the Roger Mills Circle of Care Food Program in Cheyenne, OK. The Foundation acted as a conduit for VFW Post 9126 as they moved their charter from Cheyenne to Glenpool in making this donation.

Mail received at the National Headquarters prior to Dec. 31, 2019, will be processed and counted in the December total. Mail received after that date, regardless of the postmark date, will not be counted in the December total. We suggest you have your Posts mail in their membership as early as possible or take advantage of the Online Membership System tools. Please note that email sent to individual member service center advisors is not guaranteed to be processed; please utilize the msc@vfw.org email address. The OMS system will be back online for the submittal of transactions by noon CST, Thursday, Jan. 2, 2020; however, membership transactions that are processed will not be posted to Memstats until Jan. 6, 2020. Contact: VFW Development Manager Kelly Jones, KellyJones@vfw.org. **Programs:** All-American Dashboard Update: Team "Dare to Care" – National is excited to announce that they have launched the Key Performance Indicators (KPI) tools button on the All-American dashboard on the [MyVFW](#) page on the national website. Please be sure and share this valuable information. I hope you will recognize the value of this new tool and use it to evaluate your programs and other reportable metrics from the last few years. National asks you to keep pushing the importance of using the dashboard to your Post and District Adjutants. Key Performance Indicators are the critical (key) indicators of progress toward an intended result; i.e., **impact on our communities and veterans**. KPIs provide a focus for strategic (National Headquarters) and operational (Department/District/Post level) improvement, create an analytical basis for decision making and help focus attention on what matters most. As the late Peter Drucker famously said, "What gets measured gets done." Managing with the use of KPIs includes setting targets (the desired level of performance) and tracking progress against that target. Managing with KPIs often means working to improve leading indicators that will later drive lagging benefits. Leading indicators are precursors of future success; lagging indicators show how successful the organization was at achieving results in the past. If this is your first time looking at the All-American dashboard, please take a few minutes and review the training guide and watch the training videos that are tailored to each level within the organization. Contact: VFW Programs Director Lynn W. Rolf, III, LRolf@vfw.org. **Meetings and Events:** Updated all exhibitor documents (pricing sheets, letters, application, insurance requirements). Target to send out invites/applications third week of January for 2020 for Reno convention. Finalized, through legal, housing contract (*reservation services provided for Reno convention*). Beginning review of 2021 convention hotel contracts. Due to be finalized by Jan. 31, 2020 (*18 months from actual convention dates*). Processed addendum to change 2020 long range planning dates. Requested dates to be held for 2021 planning meeting (Senior Vice Commander) and Senior Vice Commanders/Quartermasters meeting. Contracts/agreements for these two meetings to be finalized in the first quarter of 2020.

Contact: VFW Meetings and Events/Exhibits Manager Vanessa Kane, CMP, CMM, VKane@vfw.org. **Administrative Operations:** There are currently 43 Posts under suspension, one of which is new. * We have processed one Post surrender and one Post revocation pursuant to Sections 210 and 212 of the National Bylaws respectively. The organization has 6,153 chartered Posts. Administrative Operations is engaged in 20 Article IX Disciplinary Actions, 14 administrative actions and eight membership eligibility challenges. We have 31 Bylaw/Article of Incorporation submissions in for review, two of which are new; current turnaround time on Bylaw/Article of Incorporation submissions is approximately 14 days. *Of the 242 Commander-in-Chief-directed Post suspension orders issued on July 2, 2019, for failure to submit an election report by July 1, 2019, there are currently 17 Posts still under suspension and an additional 26 Posts under suspension for reasons other than failing to submit an election report, for a total of 43 Posts under suspension. We are currently working with those Departments affected to either bring these Posts to good working order or revoke their Post charters. Contact: VFW Administrative Operations Director Johnathan Duncan, JDuncan@vfw.org. **VFW Foundation:** Jesse James Dupree, lead singer, guitarist and primary song writer for the rock band Jackyl, has been working closely with the VFW Foundation to raise awareness and support for the VFW Unmet Needs program. Concertgoers are encouraged to text 'NEEDS' to 20222 in order to donate \$5 to the VFW Unmet Needs program during concerts, and local VFW Posts are hosting local events and raffles to raise additional funds. Combined efforts to date have raised over \$24,000 for Unmet Needs. Jesse stopped by VFW Headquarters today for a meet-and-greet with VFW employees. Jackyl will perform in Kansas City, Missouri, on Dec. 21, 2019. This holiday season, VFW members and friends are encouraged to support VFW programs and services by shopping through AmazonSmile.
