General Orders No. 1 2022-2023 Series

Attention is directed to: **National By-Laws, Sec 216, Elected and Appointed Officers; Chairmen and Committees.** Post Officers, elected and appointed, shall submit proof of eligibility to the Post Adjutant. Post Officers shall not be installed or assume the duties of their office until proof of eligibility has been submitted and properly reviewed. Such proof of eligibility shall be open to and reviewed by the Commander, Adjutant and Quartermaster prior to installation to office. In the event an elected or appointed officer fails to submit proof of eligibility within (30) days of election or appointment, any right of the officer to hold the office shall be forfeited, the office declared vacant and the eligibility qualifications of such officer shall be questioned in accordance with the provisions of Section 108 of the National Bylaws.

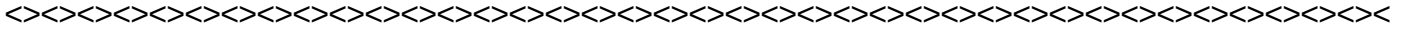

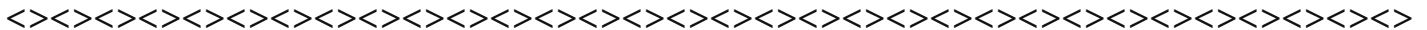

Meeting & Events:

Our 123rd National Convention is soon to be convened in Kansas City. Convention housing has now downloaded the rooming lists to the various VFW hotels. As many of you are probably aware, Comrade Herschel “Woody” Williams, a Gold Legacy member from VFW Post 7048 in Fairmont, West Virginia passed away on 29 June 2022. Woody was the last living WWII Medal of Honor recipient. If you are interested in reading about the life of this comrade who epitomized the term “STILL SERVING”, please go onto our national website and read about his life. He set an excellent example for all of us!

VFW 2022 Voice of Democracy State Winners Attend Spirit of America Youth Leadership at Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge

Over 30 VFW 2022 Voice of Democracy state winners traveled to Valley Forge, Pennsylvania, to attend the Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge’s Spirit of America Youth Leadership program. For years, the two organizations have been connected through the VFW’s Voice of Democracy program, a patriotic audio essay competition that, in 2022, had nearly 25,000 high school students competing for the \$30,000 national grand prize scholarship.

Every year the top 53 VFW Department winners from the 50 U.S. states, and from overseas areas in Europe and the Pacific, come to Freedoms Foundation each June to participate in a Spirit of America Youth Leadership program - a transformative four-day residential program that engages high school students from across the country with the first principles of freedom. Their experience is filled with inspiring and educational activities, including a mock congressional debate, free enterprise challenge, workshops, and historical site visits while developing their leadership skills and identifying their future contributions to society.

“For more than 75 years, the VFW has remained committed to connecting America’s youth with the importance of patriotism and freedom, so teaming up with the Freedoms Foundation was a natural choice,” said VFW Programs Director Lynn Rolf III. “Being able to provide our nation’s best and brightest high school students with an up-close and personal experience with their civil liberties in action helps to fortify them as America’s next great generation of leaders.”

“The students participating in the Voice of Democracy program represent the finest of America’s rising generation,” said David Harmer, CEO of Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge. “We’re honored to work with the Veterans of Foreign Wars in equipping these future leaders with a deep understanding of both the rights and responsibilities of citizenship. Here in Valley Forge, crucible of the American Revolution, they are not merely informed, but transformed into the thoughtful, informed patriots we need to safeguard our freedoms.”

National Legislative Service

The newly titled Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022, known as the Honoring our PACT Act, passed the Senate with an 84–14 vote. “This is an enormous victory for veterans, service members, and their families,” said VFW National Commander Matthew “Fritz” Mihelcic. “The Senate-amended PACT Act must now go back to the House for a vote before it can be sent to the president for signature. Thanks must go out to each of you in Oklahoma who reached out to their senators urging them to support this historic legislation. (BTW, Oklahoma Senator Inhofe voted for this bill, Senator Lankford did not.)

VFW National Legislative Service Director Pat Murray testified at a Senate Committee on Veterans’ Affairs hearing to review VA’s budget request for fiscal year 2023 and 2024 advance appropriations. “We would like to thank this committee and especially the staff. We are on the eve of passing one of the largest veterans’ benefits expansions in generations,” said Murray. The aging infrastructure and budget are crucial now more than ever as we look to support VA into the future and with the impending passage of the Honoring our PACT Act. Watch the hearing or read the testimony.

The Wounded Warrior Project has awarded a \$250K renewal grant to the VFW in support of sustained operations for our Benefits Delivery at Discharge (BDD) component of VFW’s National Veterans Service (NVS) program at 12 sites: Fort Stewart, Fort Riley, Joint Base Andrews, Nellis Air Force Base, Fort Drum, Fort Hood, Fort Bliss, Fort Belvoir, Fort Bragg, Naval Station Norfolk, Fort Campbell and Joint Base Lewis-McChord. This grant reaffirms the incredible service of excellence of VFW’s NVS and its exceptional reputation among other veterans' service organizations.

VMS Programs are an integral part of the VFW’s never-ending obligation to assist members of the active-duty military, National Guard and reserves, as well as their families. VMS is broken down into 3 distinct stand-alone programs.

- Unmet Needs
- Military Assistance Program (MAP)
- VFW “Sport Clips Help a Hero Scholarship” program

* Unmet Needs provides financial assistance to service members, veterans, and their families experiencing a financial hardship directly related to their military service.

* Assistance, not a hand out.

- * The financial assistance is in the form of a one-time grant in an amount up to \$2,500. All grants are paid directly to the “creditor” companies (such as the electric company, mortgage company, landlord, etc.) and not to the individual.
- * Funds can be used for rent, car repairs, medical expenses, infant-care items and many other necessities.
- * Each case is reviewed individually and acceptance determined by a committee.
